Since 1493, ideas & laws based on the "Doctrine of Discovery" were used to justify European sovereignty over Indigenous lands & peoples around the world. In 2015, Canada's Truth and Reconciliation Commission (TRC) called upon churches to repudiate this 15th century doctrine.

What is the Doctrine of Discovery? Why should Christians reject it?

Watch a 43-minute film that explains the Doctrine of Discovery from a contemporary Christian perspective including how it has affected Indigenous Peoples in North America.

Discovery gave legal cover to a massive corporate land grab on Vancouver Island over a century ago. Discussion to follow. Robert Morales is Coast Salish and a member of Cowichan Tribes. **Robert Morales**, is the Chief Negotiator and lawyer for the Hul'qumi'num Treaty Group (HTG) on Vancouver Island. He represented the HTG in the Inter-American Commission on Human Rights and as intervener in the landmark *Tsilhqot'in* case

in the Supreme Court of Canada.
